Notebook

This is the first season since 1993-94 in which two Centennial teams ended the season with 20-plus victories - Franklin & Marshall (22-5) and Johns Hopkins (21-6). Five years ago, it was the same two teams - F&M (26-2) and Johns Hopkins (20-7). This is also the first season in which five Conference teams won 16 or more games in a season.

This is the third straight season in which the road team won the Conference championship game. Dickinson (1997) and Muhlenberg (1998) turned the trick the previous two years.

Ursinus' Richard Barrett became the first sophomore in Conference history to win the scoring title, averaging 21.3 ppg. He also set a CC record for three-point field goals made in a season with 86.

Washington's Greg Adams had the second-best free throw percentage in Conference history, connecting on 141-of-158 for an 89.2 percentage. Only Paul Howard of Gettysburg at 89.7 percent (52-58) in 1996 had a better percentage.

The Conference could be even stronger next winter, as most teams were laden with underclassmen. Each of the five playoff teams graduate just one senior from their roster.
