Offensive Player of the Week

Zach Baylin, Johns Hopkins
 Senior, WR, 5-9, 165
 Wilmington, DE (Tatnall School)

Baylin set a school record with 14 catches for 120 yards and a career-high three touchdowns as the Blue Jays ended Western Maryland's 33-game Conference winning streak with a 21-14 victory at Westminster. He ends his career as the second-leading receiver in school and Conference history with 191 receptions.

Defensive Player of the Week

Keith Adams, Gettysburg
 Senior, LB, 6-1, 215

Adams had a big day in the Bullets' 24-16 victory over Franklin & Marshall, registering seven tackles, intercepting a pass to set up a touchdown and recovering a fumble in the end zone for a score.

Honor Roll

Mike Smith, Dickinson (Sr, RB, 5-9, 165, Bangor, PA / Bangor) - Smith carried 15 times for 90 yards and scored twice vs. Ursinus. He had 165 all-purpose yards on the afternoon.

Matt Wagaman, Franklin & Marshall (Jr, WR, 6-2, 178, Lititz, PA / Warwick) - Wagaman caught six passes for 115 yards and a touchdown vs. Gettysburg.

Mike Lublanecki, Gettysburg (Fr, HB, 5-10, 190, Long Valley, NJ / West Morris Central) - Lublanecki set career highs with 23 carries for 151 yards and two touchdowns vs. Franklin & Marshall. He scored on runs of 39 and 59 yards in the second quarter.

Shearrod Duncan, Ursinus (Sr, RB, 5-3, 165, Amityville, NY / Holy Trinity) - Duncan rushed for 110 yards and scored four touchdowns vs. Dickinson. He scored on runs of one, three and nine yards, while also hauling in an 11-yard pass for the fourth TD.

Honor Roll

Matt Rossi, Dickinson (Sr, LB, Hockessin, DE / Hill School) - Rossi led the Devils with nine tackles, including three for losses, vs. Ursinus.

Chris Gallino, Franklin & Marshall (Jr, DE, 6-1, 218, Douglasville, PA / Daniel Boone) - Gallino tallied nine tackles, including three for loss of yardage, vs. Gettysburg.

Marc Della Pia, Johns Hopkins (Sr, LB, 5-8, 198, West Caldwell, NJ / James Caldwell) - Della Pia spearheaded a Blue Jay defense that held Western Maryland over 30 points and 100 yards below its season averages. He had a team-high nine tackles, including four solos, and came up with an interception in the final two minutes to seal the win.

Mike Koth, Muhlenberg (Jr, DE, 6-1, 217, Oradell, NJ / River Dell) - Koth won the Bianco Award as the Mules' MVP of the Moravian game after recording a career-high 10 tackles, including 3 1/2 for losses.

Mike Dale, Ursinus (Sr, DB, Southampton, PA / Archbishop Wood) - Dale had four tackles, broke up a pair of passes, blocked a punt that was returned for a touchdown and scored on an 83-yard kickoff return vs. Dickinson.

Jesse Hudson, Western Maryland (Jr, DT, 6-3, 230, Berryville, VA / Clarke County) - Hudson registered six tackles, including one for a loss, while picking off a pass and breaking up two others vs. Johns Hopkins.

Team-by-Team Notes from around the Conference

DICKINSON (5-5, 3-3): lost to Ursinus, 40-28.

The Red Devils closed their season with a loss at home to Ursinus. Dickinson was just 1-4 at Biddle Field this season. For just the second time in 52 games under head coach **Darwin Breaux**, the Red and White lost a game after taking a lead into the final period. Dickinson forged a 28-14 lead early in the third quarter on two TD runs by senior RB **Mike Smith (Bangor, PA / Bangor)**, another by senior FB **Ryan MacPhee (Leonardo, NJ / Mater Dei)** and a blocked punt return of 16 yards by junior DB **Andy Kerstetter (Camp Hill, PA / Cedar Cliff)**. But the Bears reeled off 26 unanswered points, including 14 in the final 4:02 for the win. Freshman QB **Jake Ramsey (Duncannon, PA / Susquenita)** rushed for 112 yards on 25 carries to lead a 325-yard ground attack. Smith and MacPhee both gained 90 yards on the day. Smith ended the year with 909 yards and 11 touchdowns on the season. MacPhee was second on the team with 450 yards, as both backs rushed for more yards than the Devils threw for as a team (406). Senior DE **Keith Fischer (Far Hills, NJ / Bernards)** led the team with 71 tackles, while classmate **Erik Sadowski (Clarks Summit, PA / Abington Heights)** topped the defense with seven sacks and 15 stops for losses. Dickinson has had 15 consecutive non-losing seasons.

FRANKLIN & MARSHALL (1-9, 0-6): lost to Gettysburg, 26-14.

The Diplomats closed out their fifth straight losing season with a loss to arch-rival Gettysburg. It is the longest streak for F&M since losing campaigns in 1904-05-06-07-08. It was the first time that the Blue has lost at home to the Bullets since 1982. Junior DE **Chris Gallino (Douglasville, PA / Daniel Boone)** registered three tackles for losses, giving him 18 for the season and 34 for his career. The 18 is the second-highest total by a Conference player in a season, while the 34 sets a Centennial career record. F&M was outscored, 81-0, in the first quarter and 210-12 in the first half this season. Senior PK **Steve Linebaugh (York, PA / Central York)** booted a 42-yard field goal in the second quarter - the longest of his career. Junior TE **Matt Wagaman (Lititz, PA / Warwick)** led the team with 47 receptions for 698 yards. Sophomore LB **Andy Rehring (State College, PA / State College)** paced the defense with 107 tackles.

GETTYSBURG (4-6, 1-5): d. Franklin & Marshall, 26-14.

The Bullets wrapped up their winningest season in four years with a victory over traditional rival Franklin & Marshall. It was Gettysburg's first win in Lancaster since a 28-18 triumph in 1982, snapping a nine-game winless streak (0-8-1) at Sponaugle-Williamson Field. Freshman HB **Mike Lublanecki (Long Valley, NJ / West Morris Central)** set career highs with 151 yards on 23 carries, scoring on runs of 39 and 59 yards. His 676 yards is the most by a Bullet freshman since **Paul Smith** rambled for 888 yards in 1996. Senior LB **Keith Adams (Hanover, PA / New Oxford)** recovered an F&M fumble in the end zone for a touchdown and set up another score with his fourth interception of the year. Senior LB **Ryan Moore (Glenolden, PA / Interboro)** closed out his stellar career with an 11-tackle performance vs. the Dips, giving him 430 for his career. Freshman FB **Kyle Sylstra (Oxford, NY / Oxford Academy)** carried 15 times for 55 yards in his first collegiate start. Fellow rookie **James Harrell (Waldorf, MD / Westlake)** led all players with a career-best 17 tackles. The Orange and Blue went the entire season without throwing a touchdown pass - something that has not occurred since records were kept at the school in 1948.

JOHNS HOPKINS (6-3, 4-2): d. Western Maryland, 21-14.

The Blue Jays ended Western Maryland's 33-game Conference win streak with a 21-14 win in Westminster. Hopkins was the last team to defeat the Green Terror, winning 13-3 on Nov. 16, 1996. The JHU defense held WMC 30 points under its season scoring average and 100 yards under its season yardage average. The Jays came up with a fumble recovery and intercepted two passes in the final 12 minutes - all within the JHU 30-yard line. Senior QB **Rob Heleniak (Philadelphia, PA / Germantown Academy)** was 28-of-45 on the day for 242 yards and three TDs - all going to senior WR **Zach Baylin (Wilmington, DE / Tatnall School)**. Baylin snared 14 balls on the day for 120 yards, setting a school record for catches in a single game. His 58 receptions led the Conference, making him just the second receiver in Centennial history to lead the CC in catches three times. Senior PK **Matt Andrade (Wyoming, DE / Caesar Rodney)** nailed all three of his point-after attempts, ending his career with 27 straight PATs, equaling the Conference record. The Hopkins defense did not allow a touchdown pass this season, breaking the Centennial record while becoming the first NCAA Division III team since Dayton in 1980 to turn the trick. Senior RB **Scott Martorana (Long Valley, NJ / West Morris Central)** led the team in rushing with 548 yards in just six games. Hopkins recorded its eighth winning season in head coach **Jim Margraff's** 12 campaigns.

MUHLENBERG (7-3, 5-1): lost to Moravian, 17-7.

The Mules went through the thrill of victory and the agony of defeat last Saturday with its 17-7 loss to local rival Moravian. The defeat ended Muhlenberg's four-game win streak, but Western Maryland's loss to Johns Hopkins gave the Cardinal Red and Grey a share of its first Centennial championship since 1986 and third title overall. Junior QB **Justin Jones (Bloomington, NJ / Pompton Lakes)** tossed a three-yard touchdown pass to senior TE **Michael Stankowitz (Westwood, NJ / Westwood Regional)** on Muhlenberg's first possession for a 7-0 lead, but the Mules committed seven turnovers the rest of the way. Senior WR **Joshua Carter (Mt. Vernon, NY / Rye Country Day)** caught four passes to tie **Rob Lokerson '95** for the school career lead with 169 receptions. His 2,189 career kickoff return yards is thought to be a Division III career record. Sophomore RB **Matt Bernardo (Lebanon Twp., NJ / Voorhees)** gained 48 yards on 13 carries to become the first sophomore in school history to rush for 1,000 yards in a season, closing the year with 1,038. Senior LB **Jon-Paul Skarpetowski (West Windsor, NJ / Peddie School)** made 12 stops to finish the season as the team leader with 74 tackles.

URSINUS (6-4, 3-3): d. Dickinson, 40-28.

The Bears' victory over the Red Devils set a number of marks for the Collegeville 11. The win guaranteed UC a third straight winning season - the first time that has happened since the 1930-31-32 seasons. The six wins for first-year head coach **Peter Gallagher** is the most by a Bear rookie coach since 1931, when **Jack McAvoy** went 6-2-1. Senior RB **Shearrod Duncan (Amityville, NY / Holy Trinity)** rushed for 110 yards and scored four touchdowns vs. Dickinson, giving him 1,747 yards and 23 TDs for the season - both establishing school records. Duncan also set marks for rushing touchdowns (19) and all-purpose yards (1,932) in a year. He rushed for 363 yards in his two games vs. Devils - 253 vs. FDU and 110 vs. Dickinson - and leads the nation in rushing yardage at 174.7 yards per game. Junior QB **Chris Rahill (Philadelphia, PA / Penn Charter)** tossed an 11-yard TD pass to Duncan, giving him 13 aerial scores on the year. Senior **Mark Hineman (West Chester, PA / Unionville)** had 17 tackles to lead the defense, ending the year with a team-high 94 stops. Senior DB **Mike Dale (Southampton, PA / Archbishop Wood)** returned a kickoff 83 yards for a touchdown, blocked a punt which was returned for a score, broke up two passes and registered four tackles on the day. He was fifth on the team in tackles (65), while leading the Bears with six picks and finishing second in all-purpose yards (590). Sophomore LB **Thomas Reilly (Philadelphia, PA / Penn Charter)** had 14 tackles and returned Dale's blocked punt 50 yards for a touchdown.

WESTERN MARYLAND (8-2, 5-1): lost to Johns Hopkins, 21-14. *Next Week:* at Washington & Jefferson (NCAAs).

The Green Terror had its 33-game Conference winning streak snapped by Johns Hopkins, 21-14. It was the first Centennial loss for WMC since the Blue Jays turned the trick on Nov. 16, 1996 by a 13-3 count in Baltimore. The loss means that the Green and Gold shares the Conference championship with Muhlenberg, but the Terror receives the Centennial's NCAA automatic berth by virtue of its 28-25 overtime win over the Mules. Senior QB **Boo Harris (Sarasota, FL / Riverview)** ran for 130 yards on 32 carries and scored on runs of nine and eight yards. Junior FB **Jemel Johnson (New Castle, DE / Hodgson Tech)** also picked up 63 yards on 13 totes, while senior WR **Teron Powell (Milford, DE / Sussex Tech)** caught four passes for 63 yards. The two regular-season defeats are the most by a WMC team since 1996, as are the two home losses. Western Maryland will be making its fifth straight trip to the 28-team NCAA championship tournament - one of just three teams to make the first five straight seasons (Mount Union, Trinity, TX).

Around the Centennial Conference

INVITED TO THE BIG DANCE: Western Maryland will be making its fifth straight appearance in the NCAA Division III football playoffs, joining Mount Union (Ohio) and Trinity (Texas) as the only three teams to make the field five consecutive years. The Green Terror, who shared the Centennial title with Muhlenberg, received the Conference's automatic NCAA berth by virtue of its 28-25 overtime victory over the Mules on Sept. 29 in Allentown. WMC, the No. 6 seed, will meet Washington & Jefferson (10-0), champion of the President's Athletic Conference, on Saturday at noon at W&J's Cameron Stadium. The Presidents, the No. 3 seed, have won both prior meetings, including a 15-6 triumph in the last meeting in 1927. The winner will meet the winner of the Widener (No. 2 seed)-Christopher Newport (No. 7 seed) in the round of 16 on Nov. 24.

MULES GAIN SHARE OF CROWN: Muhlenberg gained a share of its first Centennial title in 15 years when Johns Hopkins shocked Western Maryland, 21-14. The Mules and the Green Terror had identical 5-1 Conference records, but WMC received the Conference's automatic NCAA berth by virtue of its 28-25 overtime win over Muhlenberg in Allentown on Sept. 29. It is the third Centennial championship for the Mules, sharing a title three ways with Gettysburg and Swarthmore in 1983 and two ways with Franklin & Marshall in 1986.

NON-CONFERENCE RECORD: The Centennial Conference posted a 16-11 record (.593) against non-conference opponents. Western Maryland, Ursinus and Gettysburg all registered three wins outside of Centennial play.

SCORING MACHINE: Western Maryland averaged 41.3 points per game this season, setting a Conference record for points in a season (413). It is the fifth straight year that the Terror has led the Conference in scoring - also a Centennial record. Western Maryland also became the first team to lead the Conference in passing offense (201.4) and win the Centennial championship.

DO NOT "PASS" GO: Johns Hopkins led the Conference in pass efficiency defense for the first time since 1984 and 1985 by registering a 64.2 rating. The Blue Jays permitted just 40.4 percent of opponents' passes to be completed for an average of 90.9 yards per game. JHU did not allow a touchdown pass in nine games - the first time that has been accomplished in Division III since 1980 (Dayton).

SHEARROD DUNCAN: The Ursinus running back became just the second Bear to lead the Conference in rushing, averaging 174.7 yards per game. **Bill Sedgwick '94** was the only other UC runner to win a Centennial rushing title (1993).
