LANCASTER, Pa. -- May 11, 2001 -- Gettysburg, which won its sixth Centennial championship in eight years, placed eight players on the 2001 All-Centennial Conference men's lacrosse team which was announced today.

Gettysburg senior midfielder **Tommy Pearce (Chestertown, MD / Woodberry Forest, VA)** was a first-team selection and was also named the Conference's Player of the Year in balloting by the seven Conference head coaches. He scored 28 goals and added 17 assists for 45 points this season, including a four-goal performance in the 15-7 Centennial championship game win over Washington. Pearce is the third Bullet to win Player of the Year honors and follows in the footsteps of former teammate **Andrew Barter '00**, who won the award in 1999 and 2000.

The Bullets, who are ranked first nationally with 14-1 record, finished 6-0 in the regular season for the fourth straight year in the Conference. Joining Pearce on the first team were junior attackman **Pete Milliman (Rochester, NY / Brighton)**, sophomore long-stick midfielder **Matt McMillen (Media, PA / Penncrest)**, senior defensemen **Mike Plantholt (Cockeysville, MD / Loyola-Blakefield)** and **Adam Santry (Columbia, MD / Mount St. Joseph)** and sophomore goalkeeper **Tim McGinnis (Ellicott City, MD / Loyola-Blakefield)**. Milliman was the CC's fifth-leading scorer (24-17-41, 3.42 ppg), while McMillen, Plantholt and Santry led a defense that ranks sixth nationally in scoring defense (6.07). McGinnis ranks third nationally in save percentage (69.3) and fourth in goals against average (6.03).

Also earning All-Conference recognition for the Bullets were junior midfielder **Wes Cadman (Yorktown Heights, NY / Yorktown)** on the second team, while junior attacker **Ric Bremer (Ridgefield, CT / John Jay, NY)** received honorable mention.

Washington had two players on the first team - senior midfielder **Dan Meehan (Brightwaters, NY / Bay Shore)** and senior defenseman **Mike Campbell (Bryn Mawr, PA / Episcopal)**. Meehan was fifth in the CC in assists (24), while Campbell earned his third straight All-CC recognition, moving up from the 2000 second unit.

Haverford senior **Chris Anderson (Morristown, NJ / Delbarton School)** received his third consecutive first-team nod at attack, becoming just the seventh member of the elite club. Anderson had 55 goals and 16 assists for 71 points this season to become the Conference's career leader in goals (190) and points (265). Joining him on attack is Western Maryland sophomore **Joe Ellis (Columbia, MD / Oakland Mills)**, who scored 64 goals and assisted on 35 others to share the CC lead in points (99).

Rounding out the elite first team is Franklin & Marshall senior midfielder **Greg Ivry (Katonah, NY / John Jay)**, who had 28-10-38 this season.
