Notes

- Wallwork becomes the third Swarthmore player (seventh honor overall) to earn Centennial Player of the Year honors. She is the first back-to-back winner of the award since Amy Schmidt of Muhlenberg in 2005-06.
- Matava becomes the sixth player in Conference history to earn first-team All-Centennial honors four times.
- Wallwork and Powell were also repeaters from the 2008 first team. Wallwork and Park are first-team repeaters in doubles.
- Bhamidipati becomes the 16th player to earn first-team All-Centennial honors three times.
- Four students were also named to the Conference Academic Honor Roll, which recognizes sophomores, junior and seniors who are key performers and have a 3.40 cumulative grade point average or higher.
